As the Christmas season approaches, the South Kerry CoDesRes team are beginning to look at how we all can look to embed the sustainable development goals within the context of still enjoying the yuletide festivities. With wrapping paper, décor and consumption it is hard to walk the tightrope between the wonders of Christmas and the waste, and the stress of it all can lead to a difficult balance to achieve.

The festive season offers a great opportunity to embed the sustainable development goals in our daily lives, and one of CoDes aims is to promote a circular economy where we consider potential waste as a resource. The circular economy aims to move away from the 'make use dispose' approach by keeping materials in use for longer, therefore maximising their value as well as recovering and regenerating materials such as plastic, bottles, is their arts / design-led methodology so many of our projects, actively aim to reconsider how we can re-use waste materials such as plastic, bottles,

and packaging. Cahersiveen has been hosting an event on that date for a number of years now, evolving from the traditional start of Christmas and the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. These days the 8th of December in Cahersiveen is also an ideal opportunity to celebrate communally while encouraging sustainable practices such as shopping local and a social family event. CoDes are looking forward to creating a beautiful and magical grotto with waste materials as part of the message of connecting with the season, our planet and each other.
